

Note to Giles County Quilt Documentation Day participants:

The Giles County Historical Society thanks you for sharing information about your family and your quilts with us. Please bring what you are willing to share.

We expect the process to take about an hour. You might like to pick up forms from the Historical Society or print them from our website (www.gilescountyhistorical.org) to fill out ahead of time.

Tips to make the process go more smoothly and what information quilt makers/owners should bring:

- Dates of births and deaths of quilt maker and her/his family. Family occupation.
- Date quilt begun, ended
- Group name that quilt maker belonged to, date began, ended
- We hope to record the stories about the quilt's ownership, and the stories about the quilt. If you feel more comfortable doing that in writing, please bring that with you.
- We'd like to take your picture with the quilt
- If this is a family quilt, we'd like a picture of the quilt maker and other pertinent photos. *We are also interested in any written information you have about the quilt, such as sketches or letters about the quilt.*
- *If you have other quilts you'd like to be documented, please sign up for October 23rd.*
- Please bring address labels if you have them, since there are different sections that ask for the information.
- Please park in the rear of the large white Museum building and enter at the basement level.

You are our best advertising. Please encourage your friends if they have quilts made in Giles County before 1806-1999 to call to register.
